<p>Project Description: The purpose of the proposed project is to construct an access road to a quarry in order to extract clay and silt for a land treatment facility. The proposed project is located approximately 5km north of Mayo along the Janet Lake Road. Activities are expected to commence in late 2008 or early 2009 and be completed within a 3 year period.</p> <p>Principal activities include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - use of heavy machinery to construct a 4 m x 500 m access road; - drilling of 8-10 test holes; - extraction of up to 63,000 m³ of material; and - ongoing reclamation.
