### Placer Claim Renewals

### Schedule of Representation Work

The *Schedule of Representation Work (Placer Mining) 2003* sets out rates and values for work on claims which may be used for assessment credit. Mining Recorders in all four districts will be using the following guidelines when interpreting the Schedule of Representation Work and determining the value of work for assessment credit on placer claim renewals. This

document must be read in conjunction with the Schedule of Representation Work in the Order in Council 2003/250.

#### Use of Actual Costs

If you intend to use actual costs, be sure to review the costs with the Mining Recorder before completing any work. The acceptance of actual costs is at the discretion of the Mining Recorder and is not automatic or guaranteed. If you have any questions, please come to the district Mining Lands Office.

#### Mobilization and Demobilization

“Mob” and “demob” costs by vehicle will be calculated at \$0.61 per km. Transportation to site by aircraft will be based on the flight tickets for one return trip. Assessment credit is not given for time hiking or walking in and out of work sites.

The maximum allowable cost useable for assessment credit will be 50 per cent of the work required to renew the claims. Credit will be given for only one return trip. Multiple trips will not be credited.

#### Hand Work

Rates for hand work are described in the Schedule of Representation Work. Mining Recorders will be using these posted rates unless otherwise agreed to in advance.

#### Machine Work

Machine work may be credited at Schedule of Representation Work rates or by actual costs. To use actual costs, the applicant must provide a receipt or the Mining Recorder will use 75 per cent of the rate listed in the Yukon government Third Party Equipment Rentals.

#### Support Staff

Credit will not be given for support staff, including administrative staff, camp staff, or “on the ground” assistants or helpers.

#### Drilling

Drill logs must include either detailed maps of sufficient scale to show individual drill hole locations and surrounding features, or GPS points for each drill hole.
